

they do not know what they are doing." And  
they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

LK 23:35 The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One."

LK 23:36 The soldiers also came up and mocked him. They offered him wine vinegar<sup>37</sup> and said, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself."

LK 23:38 There was a written notice above him, which read:

**THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS.**

LK 23:39 One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us!"

LK 23:40 But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? <sup>41</sup> We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."

LK 23:42 Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

LK 23:43 Jesus answered him, "I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise."
